

Welcome to Singapore! This is a special year for us as we celebrate SG60, the 60th year of Singapore's independence.

This year we commemorate SG60 with a special bus journey that recounts Singapore's sporting and political history, and a short film of a young Singaporean men's singles badminton player Jason Teh Jia Heng that showcases his preparations for the Open.

Starting from mid-April, SBS Transit bus service number 7 was adorned with photographs of local players, past winners and top international shuttlers who have previously competed at the Singapore Badminton Open. Bus service number 7 was chosen as it passes the Singapore Badminton Stadium which is now branded as the KFF Badminton Arena when it reopened on National Day last year. On 1 September 1999, the Singapore Badminton Hall at Guillemard became the first sports facility in Singapore to be designated a historic site by the National Heritage Board. The stadium was officially opened in June 1952. It hosted the Thomas Cup in 1955 and 1958, as well as the badminton events at 1983 SEA Games where Wong Shoon Keat won Singapore's first and only badminton men's singles gold medal. In the 1960s, the PAP had also made public speeches at the venue to celebrate their victory in the general elections, and the stadium was the site for the vote-counting for the Referendum on Singapore's merger with Malaya, Sabah and Sarawak on 1 September 1962.

As we reflect on Singapore's history, we also look forward to the future. In this illustrious gathering of talented players and ardent supporters, we come together to honour the essence of badminton – a sport that embodies discipline, sportsmanship and perseverance. This year, we warmly welcome back 2024 Paris Olympic gold medalist An Se Young and men's singles world number one Shi Yuqi who have both returned to Singapore to defend their titles. And the young talents – all under 25 years' old – will be here in full force: world champion Kunlavut Vitidsarn, mixed doubles world number one pairing of Jiang Zhenbang and Wei Yaxin, and the prodigious French talent Alex Lanier.

Let us also rally behind Singapore's own athletes at this Open – Loh Kean Yew, Jason Teh, Yeo Jia Min, Terry Hee and Jin Yujia – as they proudly represent our nation at this Super 750 event.

To the players who have worked and trained tirelessly, we commend you for your unwavering pursuit of excellence. To the Karim Family Foundation, I would like to say a big thank you for renewing the title sponsorship of the Open for the third year running and for your ardent support for the development of our national team. Jason Teh's dogged determination to win his first BWF World Tour title saw him battle through seven finals before his emotional triumph on his eighth attempt at the Thailand Masters Super 300 in February 2025. His dogged determination, remarkable resilience and perseverance are values that resonate with many Singaporeans and his fans around the world.

We are also unveiling a new crystal trophy this year with the star emblem - inspired by the stars on the Singapore flag – taking centrestage in this stunning design. The new experiential Champion Club that was launched last year is back again! The Champion Club - exclusive to just over thirty individuals - offers a unique up-close-and-personal access to the players' acclimatisation session, priority meet-and-greet sessions with players and a post-finals party on the field and play. In addition, our shuttlecock mascots are available for purchase as plush toys and bag charms, as well as KFF Singapore Badminton Open 2025 t-shirts and tote bags.

Our Singapore Badminton Carnival at the Kallang Wave Mall and OCBC Square will have a few surprises this year too! You will still have your chance to compete with your friends at the Smash Challenge, test your racket skills

The Singapore Open, as it was initially known, made its debut in 1929, decades before Singapore gained its independence in 1965. In 1990, the Singapore Open joined the International Badminton Federation Grand Prix for the first time. In 2007, the Open became part of the BWF Super Series. In 2018, it was designated a BWF World Tour Super 500 event. In 2023, the Singapore Badminton Open, with the Karim Family Foundation (KFF) as the title sponsor, joined the league of the HSBC BWF World Tour Super 750 series.




